## Question

Briefly review the arguments for and against this aspect of Senate reforms in light of the historical background that necessitated the creation of the Senate.

There are several proposals for the reform of the Senate. Some are about the composition, qualification, termination and selection process. Please take note that this question wants you to discuss specifically about the selection process of the Senate – whether it should be elective or appointive.

However, before discussing the arguments in favour and against the reforms, you are required to briefly review the historical background of the creation of the Senate, because this is a part of the question that must not be left out, if you want the maximum marks.
